These customised professional trainings would be developed exclusively for the institution by which the alumna/alumnus is employed. What kind of professional courses are relevant for your institution? Which area are you interested in: public administration, management, leadership, policy seminars or skills courses? Finally, why do you think the Hertie School is the right institution to provide this kind of training?

The Executive Training Award recognizes a specialized training project that generates impact within an organisation while simultaneously providing participants with professional growth opportunities.

The winning proposal will be realised as a one-day executive training workshop, organized by the Hertie School at your institution or organisation free of charge.

Project proposals will be reviewed by a jury composed of Hertie School faculty and Executive Education staff according to the following criteria:

- Relevance and value for the institution
- Professional development for the participants
- Innovation / Creativity
