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Alina is also a consultant for various government and international organizations, on evidence based good governance. She has recently worked for the [World Bank Development Report](#), for the [International Monetary Fund](#), for the European Parliament as principal investigator on 'clean trade', for the Swedish Government on a strategy for international donors to increase [effectiveness of good governance assistance programs](#), for the EU Dutch Presidency on [trust and public integrity](#) in EU-28, for the European Commission DG Research on [governance innovation](#).

Alina is also the designer and co-principal investigator of the 10 million euro [ANTICORRP](#) (2012-2017), a FP7 research project on effectiveness of good governance policies, and of [DIGIWHIST](#), a Horizon 20-20 project (2015-2018) which resulted in the creation of EU's public portal procurement data and indicators [Opentender.eu](#) and the public accountability tools repository [Europam.eu](#). Drawing on an international network of contributors, ERCAS has developed pioneered and built objective governance indicators like www.integrity-index.org.

Alina's main work is on state-building and institutional change, with a focus on the role of international actors in assisting transformations in other societies. Her main monographs are [A Quest for Good Governance](#) (Cambridge University Press, 2015) and [A Tale of Two Villages](#) (CEU Press, 2010). She published in [Nature](#), Foreign Policy, Journal of Democracy and several public policy journals and is frequently cited in [The Economist](#) and mainstream media. *A Tale of Two Villages* was screened as a documentary by the BBC. She has recently edited the two most up-to-date reviews of evidence on good governance policies as journal special issues in [Crime, law and social change](#) and [European Journal of Criminal Policy and Research](#).
